



Marion County Public Schools Non-Traditional School Day Information Sheet

What is a Non-Traditional Instruction Day?

A Non-Traditional School Day is a method of delivering instruction for ALL students on a day when school buildings are not accessible due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., snow days). Teachers have the opportunity to maintain an online presence for content delivery or provide a hard copy of work for students without technology or network resources. The result is decreased loss of instructional time and an increased ability to continue learning content.



Delivery

Both digital and hard copy lessons will be available for ALL students on NTI days.

Preparation

Teachers will release the first two lessons no later than November 4. Lessons are available on the school district's website with paper copies available from individual teachers.

Communications

A One-Call will be made to all students and staff announcing Non-Traditional Instruction (NTI) days. I

Information will also air on WLSK 100.9 FM.

Accountability

Students are required to complete all assigned tasks on an NTI day. Extended time will be available for those circumstances whereby work could not be completed due to extenuating circumstances (e.g., loss of power).

Availability

Teachers will maintain an online presence.
